ESTABLISH AND ENFORCE POOL SAFETY RULES

Set and clearly communicate pool safety protocols for both children and adults, like no unaccompanied kids in the pool area

Assign lifeguard duties to at least one of the adults who are present, this will help to ensure that someone is responsible for watching out for all swimmers
